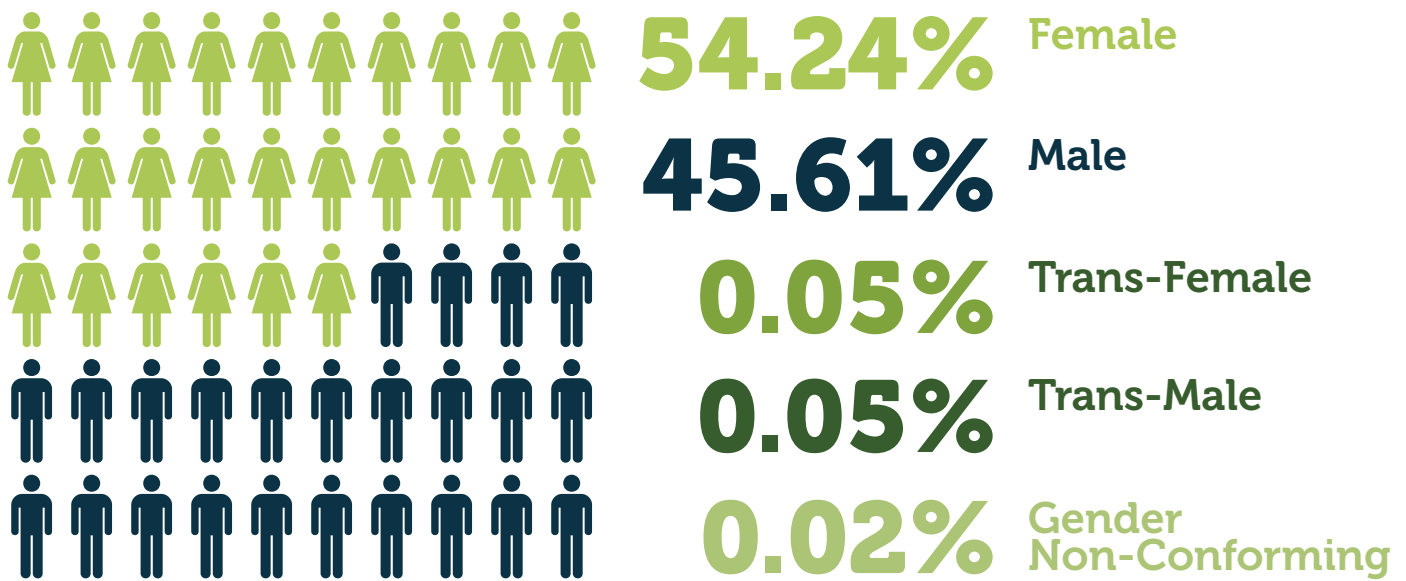


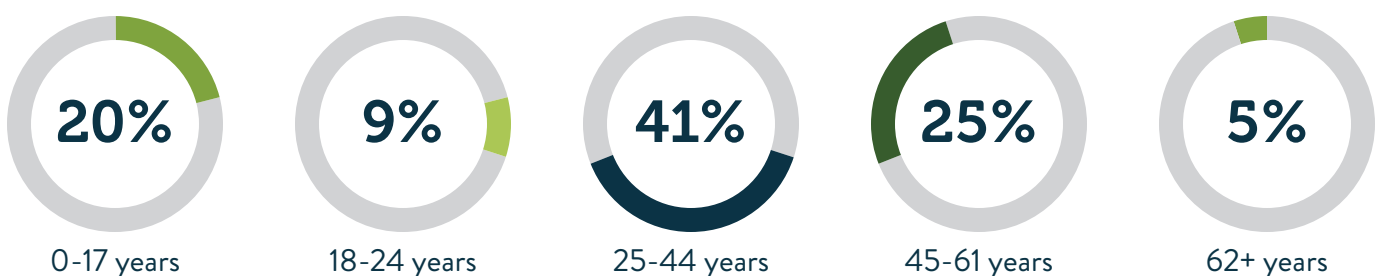
Who **experiences homelessness** in Kern County?

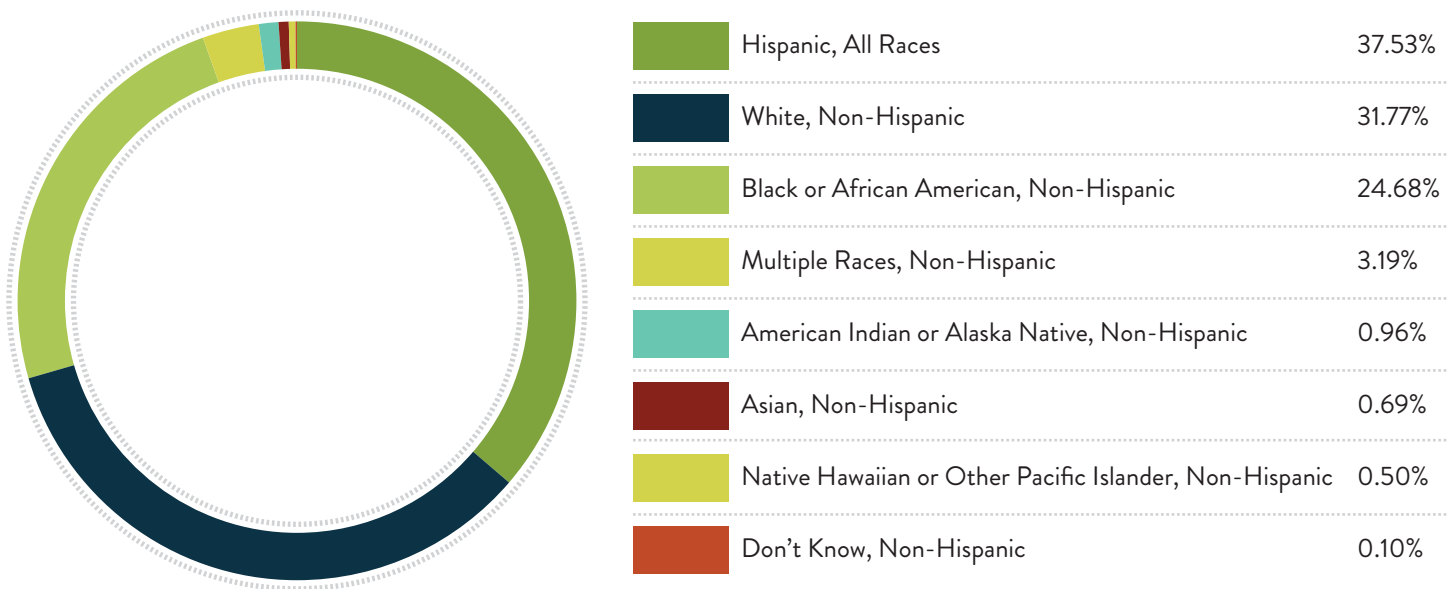
Females & males equally experience homelessness.
